Grading & Category Weights

Productive Skills (writing and speaking) = 35%

- Short answer or fill-in-the blank activities
- Brief paragraphs
- Skits or presentations
- Partner or group interactive activities
- Written or spoken portions of projects, quizzes, or tests

Receptive Skills (reading and listening) = 35%

- Listening comprehension activities using audio recordings and/or videos
- Reading comprehension
- Listening or reading portions of projects, quizzes, or tests

In-Class Practice and Participation = 15%

- Participation in partner and group conversations
- Participation in large group discussions and activities
- Short vocabulary and grammar practice or review activities

Homework = 15%

 Daily practice and review activities including elements of reading, writing, speaking, and/or listening graded on completion and effort – it's ok to make mistakes!

- Be prepared! Bring a folder or 3 ring binder with dividers, writing utensils, and notebook with you every day.

Online Resources for Español 1


Bookmark the following websites on your phone and laptop to use as resources to help you practice, review, and study Spanish.

Course website (senoraburak.weebly.com): The best resource to help you be successful in la clase de español is our <u>class Weebly site</u>. Our class landing page includes announcements, a brief outline of the day's lesson, homework assignments, and upcoming quiz dates. Each chapter has its own tab with vocabulary lists, grammar notes, practice activities and a variety of supplemental materials like videos or infographics. Weebly

Descubre 1 (VHL Supersite): To access our online textbook and workbook activities, log into the VHL app through <u>ClassLink</u>. You will not be able to access our online materials directly through the textbook website. If you receive an error message when trying to access our textbook, logout of VHL, close the window, refresh ClassLink, and select the VHL app again (you must do each of these in exactly this order). Look at your dashboard or select the assignment calendar to see online homework assignments. Use the chat feature on the VHL Supersite for tech support. If you still have issues after troubleshooting, please let me know right away.





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Useful Apps

Download the following apps on your phone to help you study and learn new vocabulary. Both apps are also available as web versions.

Quizlet (Quizlet.com): Great study tool! Make flashcards for your vocabulary words, verb forms, and other important concepts. You can add pictures instead of an English definition too. When switching between the app and web version, use the same account information to sync your flashcard sets and progress. There are many other free flashcard apps so if you prefer a different one, go ahead and use it!

SpanishDictionary (spanishdict.com): Use this Spanish – English dictionary to look up words or phrases you don't know or understand. Multiple definitions are offered to help you choose the meaning that most closely aligns with what you are trying to express, and example sentences are provided to allow you to see the word in context. Learn a new word every day with the word-of-the-day feature.
